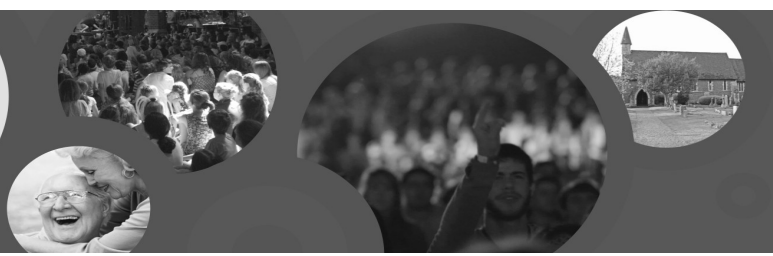

Collect & Readings 8th February 2026

Almighty God, give us reverence for all creation and respect for every person, that we may mirror your likeness in Jesus Christ our Lord.

Philippians 3:12- 4:1 NIV-UK

¹² Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already arrived at my goal, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. ¹³ Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: forgetting what is behind and straining towards what is ahead, ¹⁴ I press on towards the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenwards in Christ Jesus.

¹⁵ All of us, then, who are mature should take such a view of things. And if on some point you think differently, that too God will make clear to you. ¹⁶ Only let us live up to what we have already attained. ¹⁷ Join together in following my example, brothers and sisters, and just as you have us as a model, keep your eyes on those who live as we do. ¹⁸ For, as I have often told you before and now tell you again even with tears, many live as enemies of the cross of Christ. ¹⁹ Their destiny is destruction, their god is their stomach, and their glory is in their shame. Their mind is set on earthly things. ²⁰ But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Saviour from there, the Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹ who, by the power that enables him to bring everything under his control, will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body.

⁴ Therefore, my brothers and sisters, you whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, dear friends!

Despite writing from the bleak conditions of imprisonment, Paul urges the Philippian church to find their security and "deep joy" exclusively in knowing Jesus Christ. He distinguishes between "knowing about" Jesus and a personal, intimate relationship, likening the difference to reading about honey versus actually tasting it. For Paul, this relationship is the ultimate spiritual safeguard against despair and false teachings.

Paul provides a "resume" of his previous legalistic achievements and religious credentials, only to declare them "rubbish" compared to the surpassing worth of Christ. He argues that true righteousness is not earned through religious works or human effort but is a gift received through faith.

The challenge for us is 'how well do we really know Jesus?'

Take time this week to reflect. What am I trusting in to make me right with God?

Am I building my life around the things that are eternal or is my focus on passing achievements? This passage calls for a "180-degree turn" from trusting in self-effort to resting in the finished work of Christ, recognizing Him as the ultimate treasure.
